The CEEA courses are a unique opportunity to discuss, and share your experiences. We believe that the most successful approach to learning is to identify key topics, build relationships with colleagues and qualified speakers and to create a forum for learning and reflection.

The CEEA courses are held throughout the year in more than a hundred independent centres across the world. The duration of the course is three days and is limited to 50 participants. Complete the courses at your own rhythm, in the language of your choice, and in the order you prefer.

What is CEEA?

The CEEA - Committee for European Education in Anaesthesiology - is part of the ESA (European Society of Anaesthesiology) and organises Refresher Courses in Anaesthesiology in collaboration with the WFSA (World Federation of Societies of Anaesthesiologists).

The main goal of the CEEA is to maintain and raise the standards of anaesthetic care at the highest possible level through Continuing Medical Education in Anaesthesiology, part of the Continuing Professional Development (CPD).

Programme

The CEEA is based upon a cycle of six courses, covering in an integrated teaching programme all aspects of the speciality, including anaesthesia, intensive care, emergency medicine and pain therapy.

The six CEEA courses are:

Course 1: Respiratory and thorax

Course 2: Cardiovascular

Course 3: Intensive care, emergency medicine, blood and blood transfusion

Course 4: Mother and child. Adverse reaction

Course 5: Neurology, loco regional anaesthesia and pain therapy

Course 6: Anaesthesia according to the patient, types of surgery and modes of organisation

On the basis of one course per year, an anaesthesiologist should complete a full cycle of six courses before starting again a new cycle. Six years cycle is considered the best compromise between the time to cover the full programme and the period to renew out-of-date knowledge. This period copes with the delay for recertification introduced in most of the countries.

Where?

The CEEA is based on a network of Regional Centres managed by a course Director and a Scientific Committee. Each Regional Centre covers an area around one or more universities. The CEEA has a network of more than 100 centres spread over Europe, Asia, Latin America, Africa and Middle East.

When?

The CEEA Refresher Courses consist of a cycle of six courses, each course usually lasting two days and half to three days.

The centres decide on the dates of the courses which are published in the online calendar. Courses are taking place all year long.

How to register?

Each centre establishes the fees for each course and is in charge of the registrations of the candidates.

The centres can be contacted directly for more information about fees, speakers, accommodation, etc.
